

## **Benign Bone tumour – *Non-ossifying Fibroma***

<b>Clinical diagnosis</b>	may not be possible
<b>Investigations</b>	X rays
<b>Treatment</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- asymptomatic, small and incidental lesions are left alone</li><li>- Big lesions are curetted prophylactically to prevent pathological fractures and bone grafted</li><li>- pathological fracture – either immobilized in plaster cast till the fracture unites and then curetted and bone grafted or the fracture is openly reduced and internally fixed and at the same time the lesion is curetted and bone grafted.</li></ul>
