Clinical diagnosis	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- hard painless swelling in the metaphysis- negligible growth in recent past
Investigations	I <ul style="list-style-type: none">- X-ray- CT scan- MRI
Treatment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- excision in toto if the lesion is solitary- differentiation between benign and malignant transformation- if benign excision in toto- If malignant – investigate for lung metastasis followed by wide excision / amputation
