

Benign developmental disorders mimicking bone tumours:
Multiple Osteochondromatosis, Multiple enchondromatosis, Ollier's disease

Clinical Diagnosis	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- multiple hard swellings in the metaphyseal regions of long bones or on the flat bones or multiple globular swellings in the short long bones of hands and feet with growth disturbances- Mechanical restriction of motion of a neighbouring joint or compression of a nearby nerve- Recent increase in size and onset of pain
Investigation	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Plain x-ray- CT scan- MRI- wide bore needle biopsy- Caution: Histology cannot be relied upon
Treatment	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Lesions with complications excised- Lesions very proximal to the axial skeleton should be excised prophylactically
