Treatment	- Surgery - Excision of symptomatic tophi
	- Acute Attack- NSIADS, Colchicine, Steroids
	- Chronic (No role in acute attack) Allopurinol ,
	Febuxostat , Probenacid
	- Physical Therapy
	- Injectable medications
	- Intra articular Steroid Injection
